John Theodore Badham

13th September 1909 to 4th April 1912

John's name was the first on the School's register when it opened in 1909. He served as a cadet in the 13th O.C.B. at Newmarket, whence he was gazetted to the 4th Battalion Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders as a 2nd Lieut. Proceeding to France in July, 1918, he was attached to the 51st Division; after 6 months service abroad he was demobilised in January, 1919. He went on to Wellingborough School and from there to Jesus College, Cambridge, where he was captain of cricket. In 1926 he went to India where he taught for 20 years at the Royal Indian Military College, Dehra Dun. After his return to England he taught for 14 years at a preparatory school near Cheltenham, from which he retired in 1964. He died at his home in Cheltenham on January 23rd, 1971.

He was an assistant master at the Northgate School, Ipswich, from 1923 to 1928, and at the City of Oxford School from 1929 to 1932, when he was appointed Headmaster of Lydney Grammar School. He held this position until his death which occurred suddenly, after several months of ill-health, in his study at his school on February 20th, 1948.

After leaving school he was reading for an arts degree but at the outbreak of the First World War volunteered for service. He attained the rank of Captain in the Royal Engineers, served in France and was mentioned in Despatches. After the war he became a Fellow of the Institute of Chartered Accountants, and was for many years a partner in a well-known firm of chartered accountants, as well as director of several companies. He was a keen artist, yachtsman and golfer. He died in hospital at Bexhill-on-Sea, Sussex, on December 30th, 1960.

Among many other offices which he held were those of a trustee of the local Charity, hon treasurer of the Gipping Area Local Savings Committee. He gave valuable service to the Old Students' Association as a committee member and played important parts in many of the Dramatic Society's productions. Senior members of the staff and the upper sixth form attended his funeral service at Needham Market Congregational Church. He died suddenly at his home at Needham Market on May 28th, 1965.
